NOTES & NEWS

Trees

No trees may be planted in the ground under any circumstances. Dwarfs, slow growing that do not exceed 15' in height when mature may be planted in pots/barrels and placed so that their foliage does not obstruct driveways, streets, sidewalks, or interfere with adjoining neighbors' homesites. All trees will be subject to maintenance by park management, except fruit trees on homeowner's homesite must be maintained by the homeowner. Management reserves the right to remove any tree which is a health or safety hazard or which has roots which have escaped its pot/barrel and begun growing into the ground.

Driving Speed

Prudent speed for Community streets should be a safe speed of 15 M.P.H. or less. Unsafe or imprudent speed or use of a vehicle within the Community or failure to obey posted signs will be considered a violation of these rules. Only drivers who are properly licensed may operate a motor vehicle within the Community.

Quiet Hours

Please be courteous to your neighbors. Quiet hours are from 10:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m. every weekday; on weekends and holidays, from 10:00 p.m. to 8:00 a.m. No construction, work or noises which cause complaint from your neighbors are permitted during quiet hours. Unreasonable noise is prohibited at all times.

Guest

All guests are bound by the same rules as homeowners. Homeowners must accompany guests at all times within Community premises excluding entry to and departure from the homesite. No guest may use any common area facility (including the clubhouse and laundry room), service, amenity or be present in any common area without accompaniment of a homeowner at all times.

Balloons or Decorations

Please refrain from attaching balloons to park signs at entrance or throughout the park. Any type of decoration for an event a resident is hosting must only be placed at the homesite. Residents are responsible for cleaning up and properly disposing of these items once the event is over.



DIY Weed Killer Recipe

• One gallon vinegar; One ounce dish soap; One cup of salt; Plastic spray bottle. Directions:

"This Month In History" AUGUST

1901: Louis Armstrong is born. His rich, gravelly voice and jazzy trumpet-playing made him one of the most influential figures in his genre and generation.

1911: The "Mona Lisa" is stolen from the Louvre! All Vincenzo Peruggia had to do to steal the Leonardo da Vinci painting was hide out in a closet and wait for the museum to close. The famous artwork was recovered two years later.

1936: The Berlin Olympics open with 3,963 athletes. The "hero of the games," African American Jesse Owens won four gold medals in track and field. **1944:** The Forest Service authorizes Smokey Bear as the new face of fire prevention.

1955: A trusty source for wonderful, wacky and wild achievements, "The Guinness Book of Records" is published for the first time.

1965: "I Got You Babe" by Sonny & Cher hits No. I. The duo's signature song would stay there for three weeks.

1978: Ben Abruzzo, Maxie Anderson and Larry Newman complete the first successful transatlantic balloon trip! Piloting the helium balloon Double Eagle II, it took them 137 hours to fly from Maine to Miserey, France, just northwest of Paris.

1981: MTV shows its first music video, "Video Killed the Radio Star" by the Buggles.

2006: Pluto is demoted. The International Astronomical Union voted to change Pluto's official label from ninth planet from the sun to dwarf planet.
